RBI STATEMENT OF FAITH

The One True God—The one true God has revealed Himself as the eternally self-existent “I AM”, the Creator of the Universe and the Redeemer of mankind (Deut 6:4; Ex 3:14; Isaiah 43:10,11). God has further revealed Himself as a triune being, manifested as Father, Son and Holy Spirit (Isa 48:16; Matt 28:19; Luke 3:22).

The Scripture Inspired—The Scriptures, both Old and New Testaments, are inspired of God and are the revelation of God to man, the infallible, authoritative rule of faith and conduct (2 Tim 3:15–17; 1 Thes 2:13; 2 Pet 1:21).

The Deity of the Lord Jesus Christ—The Lord Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God and as such, shares in the Divinity and Deity of God (Matt 1:23; John 1:1; 5:22,23; Heb 1:1–13).

The Deity of the Holy Spirit—The Holy Spirit is the Comforter sent by the Father by the prayer of Jesus and who shares in the Divinity and Deity of God (Ps 139:7–10; Luke 1:35).

Original Sin and the Fall of Man—Man was created good and upright for God said: Let us make man in our image, after our likeness (Gen 1:26,27). The first man, Adam, through disobedience, fell from the grace of God and thus sin entered into the world and death by sin. Adam’s transgression incurred not only physical death for man but also spiritual death, which is eternal separation from God (Gen 2:17; 3:6–24).

The Salvation of Man—Man’s only hope of redemption and salvation from the power of sin is through the shed blood of the Lord Jesus Christ (Acts 4:12; Rom 5:8-13; 10:9; Jas 1:21; Eph 2:8).

Christ the One Shepherd—Jesus Christ is the Good Shepherd (John 10:11) and the Great Shepherd (Heb 13:20). There is one spiritual shepherd referred to in the New Testament and Jesus Christ is that one (John 10:16).

The Church and its Mission—The Church is the Body of Christ, the habitation of God through the Holy Spirit with Divine appointments for the fulfilment of her great commission. Each believer born of the Spirit, is an integral part of the general assembly and the Church of the firstborn, which was written in heaven (Eph 1:22; 2:22; Heb 12:23). Since God’s purpose concerning man is to seek and to save that which is lost, to be worshipped by man, and build a Body of Believers in the image of his Son, the responsibility of the church is:

- (a) To be an agency of God for evangelising the world (Acts 1:8; Matt 28:19; Mk 16:15,16).
- (b) To be a corporate body in which man may worship God (1 Cor 12:13).

(c) To be a channel of God's purpose to build a Body of saints being perfected in the image of His Son (Eph 4:11–16; 1 Cor 12:28; 14:12).

The Ordinances of the Church

- (a) **Baptism in Water**— the ordinance of baptism by total immersion in water is commanded in the Scriptures. All who repent of their sins and believe in Christ as Saviour and Lord are to be so baptised. This is a declaration to the world that they identify with Christ in his death and have been raised with Him in newness of life (Matt 28:19; Mk 16:16; Acts 10:47, 48; Rom 6:4).
- (b) **The Lord's Supper or Holy Communion**—The Lord's Supper consisting of the elements— Bread and the Cup of the fruit of the vine—is a symbol expressing our sharing the Divine Nature of our Lord Jesus Christ (2 Pet 1:4); a memorial of his suffering and death (1 Cor 11:26); and a prophecy of his second coming (1 Cor 11:26) and is enjoined on all believers till he come.

The Baptism in the Holy Spirit—The baptism of believers in the Holy Spirit is evidenced by the initial physical sign of speaking with other tongues as the Spirit of God gives utterance (Acts 2:4). With the baptism in the Holy Spirit comes the endowment of power for life and service, the bestowment of the gifts or enablement's of the Holy Spirit and their uses in the ministry of the body of Christ (Luke 24:49; Acts 1:4,8; 1 Cor 12:1–31). This experience is distinct from and subsequent to the experience of the new birth (Acts 8:12-17; 10:44–48; 19:1–6).

Divine Healing—Divine Healing was provided for in the Old Testament (Ex 15:23-26; Ps 103:1-3; Isa 52:4,5) and is an integral part of the Gospel (Matt 8:16,17; Acts 5:16; Jas 5:14-16).

The Second Advent of Christ—The second coming of Christ includes the catching away of the Church (1 Thes 4:16,17), followed by the actual, visible return of Christ with his saints (the Church) to reign with Him on the earth for one thousand years (Zech 14:5; Matt 24:27-30; Rev 1:7; 19:11-14; 20:1-6). This millennial reign will bring the salvation of national Israel (Ezek 39:28,29; Zeph 3:19,20; Rom 11:26,27) and the establishment of universal peace (Is 11:6-9; Ps 72:3-8; Mic 4:3,4).

The Final Judgement—There will be a final judgement in which the wicked dead will be raised and be judged according to their works. Whoever is not found written in the Book of Life will, together with the devil and his angels, the beast and the false prophet, be consigned to everlasting punishment in the lake which burns with fire and brimstone, which is the second death (Matt 25:46; Mk 9:43–48; Rev 19:20; 20:11–15; 21:8).

The New Heavens and the New Earth—We, according to his promise, look for new heavens and a new earth, wherein dwelleth righteousness (2 Pet 3:13; Rev 21:1,2).

RBI London's third year programme is designed for the student to acquire practical knowledge and experience in ministry. During this year, the students will learn how to apply what they've studied in class as well as understand the inner workings of how the ministry is run.

2. School Bell System

When session begins:

Two minutes before each class begins, 'one bell ring' will take place. This is the time for all students to return to their seats.

'Two bell rings' will indicate the class is starting now. (If you are not seated at your desk quietly at this time you will be penalized and asked to sign a 'tardy slip'. No exceptions are permitted.)

When session ends:

Five minutes before the end of each class, 'one bell ring' takes place. This is to alert the instructor of his/her final five minutes of teaching within the session.

'Two bell rings' will take place to indicate that the class is now finished. Even though the bell has rung to close the session, students are not dismissed from their seats until the instructor actually dismisses the class verbally.

3. Examinations and Grading

There will be mid-term and final examinations given every quarter, for each class. The majority of examinations are objective in nature (multiple choice/true or false). Mid-terms count 25%, Finals 50% and the remaining 25% of your mark will be decided upon and an announcement will be made for each class.

There will be a fee of £10.00 per exam.

5. Graduation Requirements

To be eligible to receive a 1st Year Certificate and 2nd Year Diploma, you must meet the following requirements:

- 1) Satisfactorily complete all 40 credit hours for year one and 40 credit hours for year two. (Failure of one course could mean no graduation).
- 2) Class attendance requirements fulfilled (see Handbook under Attendance).
- 3) Successful completion of each quarter with a 2.0 or above grade point average.
- 4) Satisfactorily complete four quarters each year of service in the Ministry of Helps; with satisfactory evaluation forms from Ministry of Helps Supervisor.
- 5) Tuition fees and any other fees must be paid in full.
- 6) The student must demonstrate evidence of true Christian life and character during the school year at RBI London. Even if one may have fulfilled the other requirements, yet are lacking in character, he/she will not graduate.

Students enrolled in this programme that successfully complete all required courses i.e. 1st Year, 2nd Year and 3rd Year and other requirements will receive a Bachelor of Ministry Degree.

Bursaries

Bursaries are available. Any bursary student will need to pay an application fee of £35 (non-refundable), the general fee of £310 and an administrative fee of £50.00 per month. Any bursary offered is at the discretion of the President of RBI London. Students who receive a Bursary with RBI London must follow Bursary guidelines and will be evaluated each quarter on an individual basis.

2. Payment Policy

LOW TUITION COMMITMENT

The River Bible Institute London has the standpoint that a quality spiritual education that trains an individual for service to the Lord Jesus Christ, should not leave that individual with an oppressive financial debt.

We therefore, have not sought the very costly regional accreditation that leads to qualification for government guaranteed student loans. Institutions using such loans generally charge the maximum tuition allowable, leaving the student with a sizeable debt at the completion of their education. For those called to the ministry, it can be very difficult to obey God's calling with this type of debt lingering over their finances. Therefore, the River Bible Institute London elected a less costly, yet just as valid independent accreditation through Transworld Accrediting Commission International.

The River Bible Institute London also does not participate in government sponsored grants, for our approach is to provide the most affordable, quality, spiritual education that we can, as a ministry to the Lord and His servants.

Please note: The Application Fee is non-refundable. The General fee covers graduation cap & gown, banquet ticket, technology fees, yearbook costs, facility usage, ID badge fees, and other student-related materials and activities.

Textbooks are not included in the cost of tuition. They are purchased separately and are the responsibility of the student.

We require all Tuition Fees and Bursary Administration Fees to be paid as set out in the Standing Order forms further down this document

REFUND POLICY

If for any reason you find it necessary to withdraw from school during the course of the quarter, the tuition will be refunded according to the schedule established in the student handbook. All requests for refunds must be made within 7 business days of last attended class in order to be considered for a refund. Please allow thirty days for any refund. **If you are expelled from school, no refund will be given.**

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

At this time, the River Bible Institute London does not offer any student loans, grants, or other financial assistance. Students are responsible for all costs.

The Standing Order is set up to enable you to make 4 payments spread over the academic year to assist the student with tuition payments.

1. Applications for UK students are due at least fourteen days prior to the first day of class and for international students at least one month prior to the first day of class.
2. Please Note: Enrolment is on a first applied, first admitted basis.
3. The River Bible Institute reserves the right of admissions.

Requirements

1. All applications must be submitted with a non-refundable application fee of £35.00 (your application will be considered incomplete without £35.00 non-refundable application fee)
2. We accept cash and card payments. (When making card payments either call us on 01707 322 244 to pay your application fee over the phone or you can come to the Finance Office in person to pay either cash or by card) The Finance Office is open from 9:00am – 2:30pm, Monday to Friday.
3. Applicants need to be able to speak and write English.
4. Please answer all questions. If a question does not apply to you, write N/A (not applicable) in the space provided.
5. You must include a recent passport-size colour photograph of yourself. Application will be considered incomplete without photo.
6. Please submit or upload a copy of GCSE results and any proof of further higher education if under the age of 25. (If you have any difficulties uploading your copy please email it to admissions@riverbibleinstitute.co.uk)
7. National students must provide a photo ID (this could be either a valid driving licence or a current passport – outdated or expired documents cannot be accepted)
8. National student must provide proof of a current address (a utility bill or bank statement under 3 months old)
